Steve Spencer added, "The Common Loon, being the iconic bird of the north woods, the haunting call and all that. We haven't gone 15 miles this whole trip without seeing one, all the way through the Gulf of Mexico. They've been evervwhere. We thought they were our bird back in Maine.'

President and CEO of the Chesapeake Conservancy, Joel Dunn, spoke to the couple about the importance of preserving Fones Cliffs and on the Conservancy's mission.

"We wanted Dunn stated, to draw in a wider audience into the Chesapeake Bay restoration movement and interest people beyond water quality, which is essential, but with wildlife and history and tap into the thousands of years of history here in the Chesapeake.

It makes you think; what was the bay like 400 years ago and what's the bay like today? What do we need to do to protect this place for future generations? The Native Americans have this philosophy of thinking seven generations ahead. We as a society, and we as conservationists, are pursuing that similar sort of philosophy of thinking about how we protect this place. I have an 11-monthold daughter. I want her to be able to experience these cliffs when she's my age. To lose them to development is a shame and we're working real hard to protect them."

The couple is currently on their way back to their home in Maine. While in the Chesapeake area, they've utilized the Chesapeake Conservancy's recently released Boater's Guide mobile application, which contains essential interactive maps. 
